



Overview North Macedonia

North Macedonia's health system provides a relatively comprehensive basic benefits package, with about 90% of the population being covered under the social health insurance scheme. Public spending on health has declined in recent years and is among the lowest in South-Eastern Europe. There is strong reliance on out-ofpocket payments which represent 42% of total health spending and are among the highest in South-Eastern Europe. Catastrophic health spending remains a problem, particularly for poorer households, and is largely driven by out-of-pocket payments for outpatient medicines.



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
